

Proper handling of the car crane keeps the crew safe and the ship damage-free.

GOOD PRACTICE

- V Before commencement of the hoisting activity, carry out a visual inspection of the crane and the hoisting equipment.
- ∨ Carry out the annual inspection seriously and document it in the crane book.
- V Use certified hoising equipment such as hoisting slings or hoisting slings with hooks.
- v Ensure that the load is properly balanced by means of a lifting beam or car cage.
- v Ensure the correct length of the hoisting slings for a safe distance from the lifting beam to the load.
- v The car crane should only be operated by properly instructed personnel.
- v Ensure that the ship is properly moored before commencement of the hoisting activities.
- Return the car crane to its rest position immediately after the hoisting activities.

BAD PRACTICE

- x Standing under the load.
- x Leaving the car crane up. There is a great risk of damage if you forget to lay down the crane.
- X Lifting heavier loads than the maximum weight indicated on the hoisting equipment.
- x Not taking into account the weight of materials/ groceries in the car when calculating the lifting weight.
- x Not using the handbrake on and/or putting the car in gear.
- x Using worn hoisting equipment.
- Moving people using the car crane.
