

**An unsafe situation or action can lead to an incident.**

**GOOD PRACTICE**

- ✓ Conduct an LMRA (Last Minute Risk Assessment) before starting any work.
- ✓ Perform tasks calmly, never in a hurry.
- ✓ If you see an unsafe situation, report it to the captain/office.
- ✓ If you see a colleague or a terminal employee performing an unsafe action, address it with them.
- ✓ Do not start the work if you believe it cannot be done safely (Stop Work Authority)
- ✓ If an unsafe situation occurs, discuss with the office/control room how to handle it (e.g., during coupling and uncoupling).



**BAD PRACTICE**

- x Ignoring an unsafe situation or action.
- x Using or offering unsuitable materials.
- x Taking shortcuts, not following the prescribed work procedures.
- x Failing to make clear agreements with each other.
- x Not paying attention to the environment where the work is being performed.



**1. Assess the risk!**

**What could still go wrong / what hazards do you see?**

**2. Think it over!**

**What is the cause of this unsafe situation? How can you avoid the hazards?**

**3. Take action!**

**Carry out the changes to make the situation more safe.**

- What are the emergency procedures in case an unsafe situation/action escalates into an incident?
